# Gilles Daigle is building a solar powered glider

Yesterday, I started a solar Sailplane. Been thinking on how to use new technology to power a radio control aircraft. No plans to follow. This design process is on the fly, based on years of building. Today, I worked on the tail section...almost done. The next step is the fuselage and figuring out space and balance. (For those interested in the technology, here are a few details).....Need to make room for 2 power paks, solar cell charge controller, mini camera, radio receiver, ESC, flight controller and possibly an auto pilot with altitude limiter...a whole bunch of stuff in a small space and have to keep it light. The solar cells will be positioned in 2 rows of 15, each producing peak 4.72 volts each in full sun closest to noon time. That should give the overall wings size about 90 to 100 inches.



From Greg Hatt: As some of you know, dad built this years ago, but it has never made it off the ground yet. So I decided to gab it now that I have the facilities and we got a start on recovering. We decided on solartex for the covering, and while I was at it, I converted it to electric. I 3d printed a dummy engine and dad painted it.

I also custom designed some battery holders for the firewall so battery changes will be a breeze. I'm going to start painting this week. We're going with the Manfred von richthofen scheme 152/17 JG.1. Red and green. Here are a few photos of where I'm at.

# That Sweet Sweet Smell - of nail polish remover?? A heads up - LIPO Battery warning.

I generally store my batteries apart from each other in open air. When we moved recently I secured quite a number of them in ammo boxes for transport and medium term storage. I was inventorying my batteries today and opened the boxes to discover a sweet smell in all of them. A bit like Nail Polish remover. A little research online, particularly in the tablet and phone tech space, revealed that it is the smell of leaking cells. Further checking revealed one or more packs in each box had cells that were reading zero volts and I assumed had leaked to atmosphere. That type of leak in a fully charged cell, if it happens suddenly spells bad news swollen packs and potential FIre. In this case the leaks seems to be very slow and it meant compromised packs which are now sitting in storage cans outside away from the house and ready soon for disposal.

The internet sages generally suggest even a slowly leaking cell can be dangerous particularly if an attempt is made to charge it without checking the cells first, something I always do anyway. This is not a warning to stop storing them in ammo cans - simply that the ammo cans trap the smell that I would have likely missed when storing them in open air. Just a heads up - sweet smelling batteries - not good! Smell of nail polish remover in your shop? Time to start checking packs! still learning something everyday. Cheers Jeremy


Sunday, July 17, 2022 10 a.m. Roland Bourque Flying Field, Hardscratch Road


