









Kent RC Association Jon Eastman Limbo Dancer







I have been wanting to build a kit for awhile now, so I finally got the chance. This is the Limbo Dancer, which is produced by a company in **England.** Many years ago my friend Al Coolen and myself had fun fly airplanes that we each built much like this one, and we had a blast flying them! I have wanted to build this one for many years now, so its finally time. This is a very well thought out kit, and the fit of all the parts is fantastic. I still have all the final sanding and then covering to do, but its coming along nicely. This has been so much fun putting together in my shop.

Been thinking about a twin for some time now and have looked at a lot currently on the market. With 3 planes currently under construction/repair, I didn't want to take on a complex kit to build, so the ARF, foam and electric power became my criteria. Once I decided on a military over civilian plane I narrowed my choices down to several options available from Motion RC. Now, do I go jet or prop? I already have an electric ducted fan F-86, however the plane is mostly unusable at our field due to the grass and the small wheels on the plane. So, that basically pushed me in the direction of a prop plane. Finally, I had it narrowed down to 2 that met my criteria, the F7F-3 Tigercat or the P-38 Lightning. As seen in the pics, the P-38 won out.

When the package arrived, I was impressed with the packing of the components. Every part was wrapped in plastic and held securely by the foam packing. Instructions were clear with good illustrations and it went together fairly quickly. One area that was somewhat troublesome was what to do with the receiver, wiring and control box as there is very little space in the pilot nacelle. I like to keep my wiring neat and accessible but that wasn't going to happen with this plane. Anyway, watched YouTube video from Motion RC and basically followed their "cram it in" advice.

The only change I made to the plane was the addition of "spring suspension" landing gear. The plane has electric retracts but the struts that come with it are solid wire with only the springiness of the wire to absorb landing shocks yes, that occasionally happens! So I opted for the spring suspension struts, hopefully that'll save the retracts some wear and tear and also smooth out those less than perfect landings.

So, the plane is ready for its maiden and I'm just waiting for that ideal day to do that. This time of the year it may be a long wait.

APPLE VALLEY FLYERS



In my travel around this year, I found that most of you are a little confused where to get all the Documents that our exemption has caused us to follow. We no longer can just drive to some field out in the country side and go flying, we now will be held accountable for our actions as Transport Canada has ruled in issuing our exemption, so in order to give you some help in walking through all those safety documents that is being tossed at you every time you turn around, we do have a Retrieval Key on our website to help you navigate through them, and I'm always just a phone call or email away if you need me. So, sit back and enjoy your reading.

Go to MAAC Website, Click on Resources, Click on Documents, Click on Advisory Group Safety. Scroll down to MAAC Safety code, Click on MAAC Safety Document MSD 02-Retrival Key. A PDF Document will open and all MAAC Safety Documents that you would need to be up to date on are right there for each RPAS category. Just click on the X and that document will open for your reading. In the not to distant future, the Safety Documents will be rewritten in a much simpler version, but the fact and intent will be the same.
